- F. Negotiations are scheduled to begin on September 15, 2022. Pre-negotiations began on September 1, 2022. The team anticipates the contract to be settled and the school corporation will need to hold an additional school board meeting on September 21, 2022 to pass a tentative agreement. Public notice must be given at least 48 business hours in advance. The CTA could ratify the contract on September 26, 2022 (72 hours after the board meeting). The final contract would be approved on October 17, 2022 with potential pay increases to be paid out on October 22, 2022.
